Teri Talk - June 2024

In May one of the second readings, or epistle lesson was from **1 John 5:9-12**. Not the gospel of John, but one of three letters in the New Testament. These short Johannine letters are followed by Jude and the New Testament then concludes with Revelation.

1 John 5:9-13 (New Living Translation)

⁹ Since we believe human testimony, surely we can believe the greater testimony that comes from God. And God has testified about his Son. ¹⁰ All who believe in the Son of God know in their hearts that this testimony is true. Those who don't believe this are actually calling God a liar because they don't believe what God has testified about his Son. ¹¹And this is what God has testified: He has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹² Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have God's Son does not have life. ¹³ I have written this to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know you have eternal life.

The original author of the story that follows is unknown, but it is one that has been used in numerous sermon illustrations by many ministers, online evangelists, and religious bloggers. It has been given different titles: The Painting, "The Son" and "Whoever Takes the Son Gets it All" are the most common. This is my adaptation.

Once there was a very wealthy man who, with his devoted young son, shared a passion for art collecting. Together they traveled around the world, adding only the finest art treasures to their collection. Priceless works by Picasso, Van Gogh, Monet, and many others adorned the walls of the family estate. Years pass and the man now widowed and elderly, took pride in his son's growth as an experienced art collector.

There was a war, as there always seems to be, and the son now an enlisted man, was sent with his unit as part of a peace keeping mission. After only a few short weeks, his father received a telegram. His beloved son was missing in action. The father anxiously awaited more news, fearing he would never see his son again. Within days, his fears were confirmed. The young man had died while rushing a fellow soldier to a medic.

Distraught and lonely, the old man faced the upcoming Christmas holidays with anguish and sadness. The joy of the season, a season that he and his son always shared together, was not something he could experience this year. But, on Christmas morning, a knock on the door awakened the depressed old man. As he walked to the door, the masterpieces of art on the walls only reminded him that his son was not coming home.

As he opened the door, he was greeted by a soldier with a large package in his hand. He introduced himself to the man by saying, "*I was a friend of your son. I was the one he was rescuing when he died. May I come in for a few moments?* As the two began to talk, the soldier recounted how his son had rescued dozens of wounded soldiers before a bullet stilled his caring heart. The soldier spoke of how the man's son had told everyone of his and his father's shared love of fine art. Referring to the large package he arrived with he said, "*I'm an artist and I have something to show you.*" As the old man unwrapped the package, the paper gave way to reveal a portrait of the son. *I want to give you this*," said the soldier. Though the world would never consider it a work of genius, the painting featured the young man's face in striking detail. Overcome with emotion, the man thanked the soldier, promising to hang the picture over the fireplace. A few hours later, after the soldier had departed, the old man set about his task.

True to his word, the painting of his son went above the fireplace, replacing his more valuable paintings. And then the man sat in his chair and spent Christmas gazing at the gift he had been given. During the days and weeks that followed, the man realized that even though his son was no longer with him, the boy's life would live on because of those he had touched.

Reflecting on the stories of his son's heroism and self-sacrifice, the father's grief began to ease. The painting of his son soon became his most prized possession, far eclipsing any interest in the pieces for which museums around the world clamored. He told his neighbors and friends it was the greatest gift he had ever received.

The following spring, the old man became ill and passed away. According to the will of the old man, in honor of his only son, all of his precious art works would be auctioned off on Christmas day, the day he had received his greatest gift. The art world waited in excited anticipation!

The day soon arrived and art collectors from around the world gathered to bid on some of the world's most spectacular paintings. Dreams would be fulfilled this day; greatness would be achieved by the one who could snag the lion's share of "*the greatest private collection*." The auction began with a painting that was not on any collector or museum's wish list. It was the painting of the man's son. The auctioneer asked for an opening bid. The room was silent.

"Who will open the bidding with \$100?" he asked. Minutes passed. No one spoke. From the back of the room someone yelled, "Who cares about that painting? It's just a picture of his son, forget it! Let's see the good stuff." More voices echoed in agreement. "No, this one must sell first," replied the auctioneer. "Now, who will take the son?" Finally, a friend of the old man spoke, "Will you take ten dollars for the painting? That's all I have. I knew the boy, so I'd like to have it."

"I have ten dollars. Will anyone go higher?" called the auctioneer. After more silence, the auctioneer said, *"Going once, going twice. Gone."* The gavel fell, cheers filled the room, and someone exclaimed, *"Now we can get on with it and bid on the real treasures!"*

The auctioneer looked at the audience and announced the auction was over. Stunned disbelief quieted the room. Someone spoke up and asked, "What do you mean it's over? We didn't come here for a picture of some old guy's son, we came for the priceless treasures, what about all these other paintings? There are millions of dollars of art here! 
